
### **YEAR 7 PLACEMENT FOR 2022**

## MAKING MATHS COUNT!

You don't need to be "good at maths" to help your children with their maths

Many parents don't feel confident when it comes to supporting their child with their maths. This week we wanted to share some ideas that were shared with us by Professor Doug Clarke. These principals have been designed to encourage and guide you to discuss Maths at home.

### HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILDREN WITH MATHS

**Build on success -** Create the impression that learning mathematics well is desirable. Encourage effort and help your children see errors as part of the learning process.

Let them work things out - People learn, not so much by being told things, as by working things out for themselves and linking new ideas to ideas they already have. You can help by asking your children questions, letting them work out answers for themselves, and then discussing their answers and strategies with them.

**Be patient -** Children need time to think and time to answer. When asking your children questions or talking to them about mathematics, give them time. Be patient. Also, explain to older children that they need to give younger siblings time to answer questions, rather than always answering for them.

**Talk about it -** Encourage children to talk. Talking about mathematics is an effective way of learning, especially when a mathematical situation arises naturally.

**Speak the language -** Use mathematical words when you describe things. For example, instead of saying "the big red bucket", you might say "the 10-litre bucket". Instead of saying "the large packet of rice", you might say "the 2-kilogram packet of rice".

**Don't rush -** There is no hurry. Children develop their mathematics skills gradually and there is no urgency about developing any particular skill. It's necessary to work progressively on helping them to learn mathematics. Start now, but there is no need to accelerate your child's development.
