SCHOOL REVIEW- Fieldwork Days Tuesday 13th & Wednesday 14th June

As part of our school review this week we were involved in what is called Fieldwork Work Days. The two Fieldwork Days were quite positive, providing great insight into our school's progress over the past 4 years. It provided an opportunity to speak to staff, students and parents.

Over the course of the two Fieldwork Days, the school review panel interviewed 12 teachers, 10 education support staff, 3 groups of students from grades 3 to 6, a parent group and undertook classroom observations across all year levels.

The school review panel was able to confirm what the priorities will be for our new strategic plan. We have one panel day remaining and this will occur on Wednesday 21st June. The panel will produce the new 4-year strategic plan. In the development of the new strategic plan the panel will confirm the school's goals, key improvement strategies and school targets for the next 4 years. I look forward to presenting this to the school community when completed.

RESILIENCE, RIGHTS AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS (RRRR)

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) learning materials have been designed for teachers to develop students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills.

Efforts to promote social and emotional skills and positive gender norms in children and young people has been shown to improve health related outcomes and subjective wellbeing. It also reduces antisocial behaviours including engagement in gender related violence.

Students will participate in weekly sessions throughout the year, covering 8 topics.

This term our first focus will be around Emotional Literacy.

To understand ourselves and other people. Express and manage our own emotions, build empathy and respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building vocabulary for emotions to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and empathy for others.

Each week a class will share an activity via the newsletter.

This week 3/4D began topic 4, problem-solving.

Our first activity was the knots problem-solving game. Students worked in groups to untangle themselves.

After the activity, students identified the skills required to do this successfully.

They were:

- *Problem-solving*
- *Trust*
- *Teamwork*
- *Collaboration*
- *Communication*
- *Resilience*
- *Focus*
- *Friendship*
- *Concentration*

We also discussed how we can use these skills in the classroom to make it an effective learning place for everyone.

Jaxon said *"we use collaboration when we come together to work on something hard."*

Kalani said *"we use resilience when we make mistakes, we don't give up, we keep trying."*

Maddy said *"we use resilience when we get something we don't like. You get what you get and you don't get upset."*

Jack said *"we use trust when we trust other students on their input."*

Nate said *"we use problem-solving when we are working on our tasks at our tables."*
