I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and relaxing term break. We look forward to seeing everyone on Tuesday 11th July (Monday 10<sup>th</sup> July is 3-Way conferences) for the start of another exciting and productive term.

### SCHOOL REVIEW- FINAL PANEL DAY

The school review panel met for the final time to determine the school goals, key improvement strategies and targets that will define our new 4-year Strategic Plan. When the new Strategic Plan has been approved I will share it with the school community. The school reviewer was very positive about the review process undertaken. Highlighting the thoroughness of the pre-review self-evaluation, the honesty and transparency of the staff, and student and parent insight into school life. The new Strategic Plan requires final approval from the Department of Education & Training.

### ASSET MANAGEMENT PLANNING (AMP)

As part of the planning for our school upgrade we were required to complete stage 1 of the AMP. This involved capturing the education vision and direction of the school in terms of learning needs and aspirations. The report focused on the teaching and learning delivered at our school; what opportunities does the upgrade present; in time what will students, teachers and parents be doing on a typical school day that typifies learning, diversity and inclusion and a high-level overview of the current facilities in regard to condition & functionality. Using this information, the second stage of the AMP will be completed which entails developing a high-level masterplan and determining a scope of works based on budget.

### MID-YEAR REPORTS & 3 WAY CONFERENCES - REPEAT

A formal opportunity for parents to discuss the progress of their child/children will occur on Monday July 10th (first day of term 3). The booking portal closed at 12.00pm today, Friday 23rd June. Letters have been forwarded home to families who have not made appointments. Please Note: students only attend school on this day for their 3-way conference. The Outside School Hours Care will run a full day program on this day.

### **ENROLMENTS FOR 2024**

So far, we have enrolments from 15 siblings of Huntly Primary School students for 2024. If have a current student at our school and they have a sibling who will be starting Foundation (Prep) next year, please collect an enrolment form from the school office and return it to us as soon as possible.

As a result we need to know all sibling enrolments as soon as possible to confirm our numbers for other enrolling students.

### SCHOOL BUS MANAGEMENT NEWS

Important update for students who are approved for travel on the School Bus Program: Thank you for your patience while the School Bus Management System (SBMS) has been under maintenance. The School Bus Management System has now been upgraded, and the new Student Travel Assistance Portal will be available from early Term 3.

It is important to note that the School Bus Program Policy has not changed, and navigating the new Student Travel Assistance Portal will be very similar to the previous SBMS.

The Student Travel Assistance Portal requires new log in

details. All existing users will be sent their new username and a link to create a new password via the email address attached to your SBMS account, to allow you to access the system.



### In relation to term 3 travel:

All eligible and conditional travellers (those approved for travel at no cost) will continue to be approved for travel in term 3.

All ineligible travellers will be communicated with shortly. They will be provided with a term 3 travel offer and payment advice. As per previous terms, families will need to make the applicable bus fare payment of \$125 to be approved for travel in term 3.
