#### **HUNTLY PRIMARY SCHOOL UPGRADE**

As communicated last week our school has been allocated \$13.18 million in the 2023/24 State budget. The funding will be used to expand the school and create space for 100 more local students.

We will work closely with the School Council and the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA) to deliver an outcome that will benefit the entire community.

To prepare for the upgrade, we will complete an Asset Management Plan (two phases) over the next 11 weeks. The AMP is a long-term document that helps to plan for a school's future. The plan identifies, organises and prioritises the building works required at a school – ensuring students have access to educational facilities that prepare them to thrive in the 21st century. We will be sharing updates on this and will be running some sessions to gather input from our staff. We will also involve our students to listen to their unique and important perspective.

The parent survey completed for the school review (a few weeks ago) will also provide valuable information that can be used as part of the Asset Management Planning -phase 1. Phase 1 focuses on education direction and delivery. I will also keep you informed through regular newsletter updates as the project progresses.

#### **SCHOOL REVIEW**

Next Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> June the school will be involved in the first official day of the school review. It is known as Validation Day. During the day the review panel will hear about the successes and highlights over the period of the current Strategic Plan; undertake classroom observations; run student focus groups; review our performance against the goals and targets in the current Strategic Plan and finally develop focus questions and an agenda for the following review days, known as Fieldwork Days. These days will occur the following week. There will be an opportunity for parents to be part of a focus group during the Fieldwork Days. I will communicate the day and time through Compass early next week. Your input, if you are available on the day, will be greatly appreciated.

#### **SICKNESS & COVID**

With the arrival of colder weather, cases of influenza (the flu) are increasing throughout Victoria. We are at risk of higher rates of students and staff affected by the flu or COVID-19 this season. To help keep your child and our school community safe, please take the following steps if your child has any cold or flu-like symptoms:

- take a COVID-19 test and follow the current Department of Health requirements if a positive result is shown
- common flu-like symptoms include a high fever, cough, runny nose, loss of appetite, body aches and feeling extremely weak and tired, please keep your child at home until their symptoms pass.
- encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and ask them to cover their nose and mouth when sneezing and coughing.

#### MID-YEAR REPORTS & 3 WAY CONFERENCES (REPEAT)

At this time of year staff will dedicate many hours to student reports in the lead up to the reports being available to families and the 3-Way Conference. Student reports can be assessed via Compass from Thursday 22nd June. A formal opportunity for parents to discuss the progress of their child/children will occur on Monday July 10th (first day of term 3).

Parents/carers will be able to book their meeting time from Friday 9th June. The booking portal will be open until Friday 23rd June.

If you are unable to book your meeting time for some reason or you are having difficulty booking online contact the school office for assistance.

Please Note: students only attend school on this day for their 3-way conference.

The Outside School Hours Care will run a full day program on this day, please see newsletter article.

#### RESILIENCE, RIGHTS AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS (RRRR)

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) learning materials have been designed for teachers to develop students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills.

Efforts to promote social and emotional skills and positive gender norms in children and young people has been shown to improve health related outcomes and subjective wellbeing. It also reduces antisocial behaviours including engagement in gender related violence.

Students will participate in weekly sessions throughout the year, covering 8 topics.

#### This term our first focus will be around Emotional Literacy.

To understand ourselves and other people. Express and manage our own emotions, build empathy and respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building vocabulary for emotions to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and empathy for others.

Each week a class will share an activity via the newsletter.

### Carlton Respect Program

In RRRR we learnt about the four types of bullying:

Physical- Touching and Hitting

Verbal- directly saying mean things

Psychological- saying mean things not to the victim

Cyber- all of the above online.

After that we sorted little cards about the behaviours in bullying, we then sorted the cards from the most hurtful to least hurtful. We went on a gallery walk and discussed how much it would affect us, and why.

For example: Saying nasty things to people about their family, and how that might affect some people more than others.





The program will be co-ordinated by experienced teachers and incorporates male and female accredited personnel (Working With Children Certified).


