BUILDING RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS IN OUR SCHOOLS

Last week I provided an overview of the Victorian Curriculum F–10 Respectful Relationship program. Students develop the knowledge, understanding and skills to strengthen their sense of self, and build and manage safe and respectful relationships. Students also learn to recognise and regulate emotions, develop empathy for others and establish and build a framework for positive relationships.

There are eight topics of Social and Emotional Learning across all levels of primary education. During term 4 the focus will be on *Gender identity and Positive gender relationships*. Content is always age appropriate. The curriculum focus aims to:

- Topic 7: 'Gender & Identity' assist students to challenge stereotypes, learn about issues relating to human rights and gender identity; and promote respect for diversity and difference.
- Topic 8: 'Positive gender relations' assist students to problem-solve, set boundaries within relationships, understand and prevent gender-based bias.

RESILIENCE, RIGHTS AND RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS (RRRR)

The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships (RRRR) learning materials have been designed for teachers to develop students' social, emotional and positive relationship skills.

Efforts to promote social and emotional skills and positive gender norms in children and young people has been shown to improve health related outcomes and subjective wellbeing. It also reduces antisocial behaviours including engagement in gender related violence.

Students will participate in weekly sessions throughout the year, covering 8 topics.

This term our first focus will be around Emotional Literacy.

To understand ourselves and other people. Express and manage our own emotions, build empathy and respond appropriately to the emotions of others. Building vocabulary for emotions to increase emotional literacy and build self-awareness and empathy for others.

Each week a class will share an activity via the newsletter.


