#### **TERM 4 2023**

Welcome back for Term 4, I hope everyone enjoyed their holiday break and the great weather.

This term finds our Grade 3/4 and Grade 5/6 students attending their respective school camps.

The Grade 3/4's are going to the Coastal Forest Lodge at Anglesea for fun filled days at the beach from Wednesday 8th to Friday 10th November.

Grade 5/6's will be travelling to Melbourne for their Urban Camp and taking in the sights of the big city with lots of fun adventures from Wednesday 22nd to Friday 24th November.

With Bendigo Cup Public Holiday, a Curriculum Day on Friday 27th October, various sporting events and end of year celebrations it is looking like a busy term ahead.

#### **SUN SMART REMINDER- 'IT'S HAT TIME OF THE YEAR AGAIN'**

In line with our Sun Smart Policy students are required to wear their broad brimmed/bucket school hats when outdoors at lunchtimes or for Physical Education during Term 4. Hats can be purchased from Lowes at the Bendigo Marketplace \$15.95 or we have a small number available from the school office.



#### SLAPPED CHEEK

There have been a number reported cases of slapped cheek at Huntly Primary School and in the wider community recently. Slapped cheek is a viral infection which usually affects students between the age of 4 and 10. Symptoms can include red cheeks (which is where the infection gets its name from) as well as fever, headaches, skin rashes, aches and pains. While there is no need to keep your child home from school if they have a rash from slapped cheek disease we do ask you to watch for symptoms and keep your child at home if they're feeling unwell with symptoms like fever.

#### CURRICULUM DAY: FRIDAY 27th OCTOBER—PUPIL FREE DAY

Just a reminder that our Term 4 Curriculum Day will be held on Friday 27th October. Students do not attend school on this day. Outside School Hours Care will run a full day program for the day, if enough families require it. *Please see newsletter article*.

#### **2024 FRIENDSHIP REQUESTS**

We understand friendship groups are important and they are always considered when planning classroom groupings for the following year. However, it is equally important to recognise the need to establish productive environments that support learning, as well as maintaining or building new friendship groups. For this reason, students will not complete friendship group lists for 2024. Each year this causes significant difficulties when we attempt to create a balance of social, emotional and academic need (for all students) across our classrooms. Teachers and Education Support Staff are best placed to determine the 'classroom balance' which will support your child.

That said, we acknowledge as parents / carers, you may (for a variety of reasons) like to make a request in relation to friendship placements for your child in 2024. (This is the same process we have used for the past 3 years).

Whilst we will take all requests into consideration, we do not guarantee that these can be implemented for the reasons mentioned above.

**Please note, it is not possible for parents to request specific teachers.** Classroom groups will be formed and then teachers will be matched with a classroom.

#### **MOBILE PHONE (Repeat Reminder)**

All government schools are required to have a mobile phone policy. Our mobile phone policy can be viewed by clicking the link. <a href="HPS-Mobile-Phone-Policy.pdf">HPS-Mobile-Phone-Policy.pdf</a> At Huntly Primary School it is expected mobile phones brought to school will be switched off and stored securely during the school day. Students are required to hand their phones into the school office each morning, where they are stored in individually named ziplock bags, then placed in a secure location for the day. Students then collect their phone at the end of the day. We ask that parents help reinforce this expectation with children. Should you have any queries around this, please contact the school.


