## STUDENT VOICE AND AGENCY

Across the school all classrooms have been focusing on supporting student sensory needs. An aspects of this has been getting the students to voice how best they learn.....

#### Grade 2/3/4 Classes

This term the 2/3/4 classes have been focusing on Student Voice and Agency, where we have been investigating how best to meet the students' sensory needs. Initially, we surveyed the students, ascertaining if their sensory needs where being meet and how this was affecting their learning.

From this we have focused on four main areas:

- Lighting
- Fidgets
- Seating / standing during instruction
- Voice levels.

So, to best meet the students' sensory needs we have introduced the following changes in the classrooms:

- 1. Lights are generally off but this does depend on the amount of daylight.
- 2. Fidgets can be used as long as they are not seen or heard.
- 3. During instruction, students can sit on the floor, stand or sit on chairs if suitable.
- 4. Implementation of voice level indicators.

Please note: these allowances may not apply when we have visiting teachers, or if any students are not respecting the new options for agency during *learning*.

## STATEWIDE TIMELINE TO MANAGE FOUNDATION (PREP) ENROLMENTS FOR THE 2025 SCHOOL YEAR

Each year, the department releases the statewide Foundation (Prep) enrolment timeline to Victorian government primary schools. The timeline includes key dates to help schools to plan for their Foundation enrolments. This also follows the release of 2025 zones on the department's Find my School website.

Before you get started please check if you are currently living in our school zone.

Due to Huntly Primary School being required to adhere to the Department of Education's Enrolment Management Plan our student enrolment is restricted to: Students who live within the school zone, Students with a sibling attending the school at the same time or Students seeking enrolment on legitimate compassionate grounds.

Foundation (Prep) Enrolment 2025 timeline include the following:

- Schools can receive enrolment forms from parents and carers who are currently living in our school zone from the start of Term 2, 2024.
- In some circumstances, where families are not currently living in our school zone an application to enrol form will need to be submitted for approval by Friday 26th July, 2024.
  - ⇒ Schools will then notify parents and carers of the outcome of their application to enrol between Monday 29th July and Friday 9th August, 2024.
  - ⇒ Written appeals from parents and carers are to be lodged with schools by Friday 23 August, 2024.
  - ⇒ Schools will notify parents and carers in writing of the outcome of appeals by Friday 6 September, 2024.

Dear Huntly Primary School families,

After The Bell Aus are honoured to be chosen as the New OSHC Service Provider for Huntly Primary School OSHC program with the support of the School Council Representatives.

We will commence working in partnership in April 2024, Term Two. After The Bell Aus will be providing Before School Care, After School Care and Vacation Care. The commencement date is proposed to commence the 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2024, pending The Department of Education commencement transfer approval date.

As part of the Transfer of service we have licenced the service for 45 places, this will support the care needs of families who are currently on the After School Care waiting list.

#### **How To Register**

We understand that filling in forms is not the highlight of everyone's day, but as a licensed Child Care provider, we require all guardians child (ren) accessing our services to complete the mandatory registration form prior to their child attending the service. Even if one was already filled with Huntly PS.

This registration is a legal requirement for ATB to accept children into our care and gives After The Bell Aus staff all the necessary information so we can provide the best care for each child entering our doors. Registration is vital when accessing Child Care Subsidy to support the cost of the care to you.

We ask families to not wait to the last minute to register. As the first stage of the registration process can take up to 3 business days to process. Once this step had been actioned by the guardian After The Bell Aus can approve your child's registration form and booking into care can commence. Please note any registration that required more consideration such as medical conditions, requires additional processing time.

#### **Program Delivery**
