FOUNDATION 2025 (PREP) ENROLMENTS

Steps to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) for the 2025 school year

To start primary school in 2025, your child will need to turn 5 years old by 30 April 2025. Schooling is compulsory for children who have turned 6 years old.

Importantly, your child has a right to enrol at their local school and will be guaranteed a place. The local school is determined on the basis of their permanent residential address. Before you get started please check if you are currently living in our school zone by searching your address on the department's <u>Find my School</u> website.

Due to Huntly Primary School being required to adhere to the Department of Education's *Enrolment Management Plan* our student enrolment is restricted to: Students who live within the school zone, Students with a sibling attending the school at the same time or Students seeking enrolment on legitimate compassionate grounds.

How to enrol at Huntly Primary School:

- If you wish to enrol your child for Foundation 2025 and you are **LIVING** in our school zone (please bring proof of residency address) or your child has siblings attending Huntly Primary School you can collect an Enrolment Pack from the school office or at the Information Evening on Tuesday 14th May 6.00pm to 7.00pm.
- If you wish to enrol but you are currently **NOT LIVING** in our school zone or do not have a sibling at our school an "Application to Enrol" form will need to be submitted to the school for approval by Friday 26th July, 2024. Please pick up a copy of the "Application to Enrol" form from the school office or download the following document Foundation-ParentCarerPack-2024-25.pdf
 - ⇒ Schools will then notify parents and carers of the outcome of their application to enrol between Monday 29th July and Friday 9th August, 2024.
 - ⇒ Written appeals from parents and carers are to be lodged with schools by Friday 23 August, 2024.
 - ⇒ Schools will notify parents and carers in writing of the outcome of appeals by Friday 6 September, 2024.


BOOK FAIR

Dear Huntly Primary School families,

After The Bell Aus are honoured to be chosen as the New OSHC Service Provider for Huntly Primary School OSHC program with the support of the School Council Representatives.

We will commence working in partnership in April 2024, Term Two. After The Bell Aus will be providing Before School Care, After School Care and Vacation Care. The commencement date is proposed to commence the 15th of April 2024, pending The Department of Education commencement transfer approval date.

As part of the Transfer of service we have licenced the service for 45 places, this will support the care needs of families who are currently on the After School Care waiting list.

How To Register

We understand that filling in forms is not the highlight of everyone's day, but as a licensed Child Care provider, we require all guardians child (ren) accessing our services to complete the mandatory registration form prior to their child attending the service. Even if one was already filled with Huntly PS.

This registration is a legal requirement for ATB to accept children into our care and gives After The Bell Aus staff all the necessary information so we can provide the best care for each child entering our doors. Registration is vital when accessing Child Care Subsidy to support the cost of the care to you.

Registering your child through our secure online registration system is required to provide care. https://parent-portal.kidsoft.com.au/enrolment-form?URLCode=AfterTheBellAus

We ask families to not wait to the last minute to register. As the first stage of the registration process can take up to 3 business days to process. Once this step had been actioned by the guardian After The Bell Aus can approve your child's registration form and booking into care can commence. Please note any registration that required more consideration such as medical conditions, requires additional processing time.
